Marina will be volunteering with the Youth Support Program in Lisbon which offers academic support, childcare, and enrichment activities to local underserved youth.

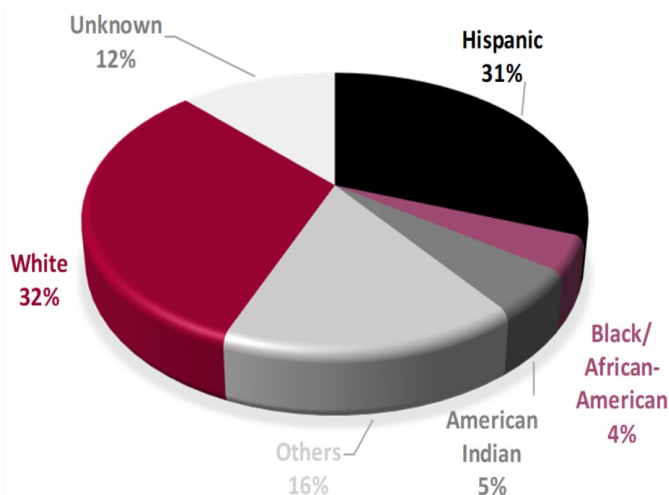
Chihuahua University Exchange

College of ACES has a Joint graduate degree program in Food Science and Technology. A Joint international conference was organized at UACH in April. Four NMSU students participated in the conference.

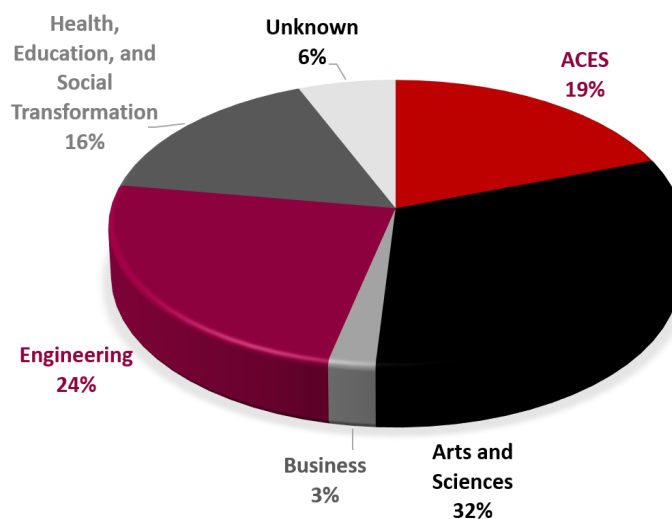
Nepal: Brendan Glenn
